

**Dr. Robert K. Dixon**

Dr. Robert K. Dixon is currently Head, Energy Technology Policy Division International Energy Agency (IEA), Paris, France.

He served as Associate Director, International Activities, Council on Environmental Quality, Executive Office of the U.S. President in 2005.

From 1999 to 2002 Dr. Dixon served as DOE Deputy Assistant Secretary, Office of Power Technologies. In 2004 the U.S. President honored Dixon with the U.S. government Senior Executive Service Gold Award for service to DoE and the nation.

Dr. Dixon led two U.S. Presidential Initiatives from 1992-1998: the U.S. Country Studies Program and the U.S. Initiative on Joint Implementation to advance the strategic goals of the U.N. Framework Convention on Climate Change (FCCC). In 1991, Dixon was seconded to the EPA Policy Office to support the Administrator and the Executive Office of the U.S. President in preparation for the 1992 U.N. Conference on Environment and Development (Earth Summit). He was awarded the EPA bronze medal for his contributions.

Dr. Dixon earned his B.S, M.S. (1979) and Ph.D. (1982) degrees from the University of Missouri, Columbia, Missouri. Dr. Dixon lectures at the Johns Hopkins University Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced and International Studies (SAIS), Columbia University and Georgetown University. He also has been a consultant and contributor to the U.S. National Academy of Science and the U.S. National Academy of Engineering activities during the past 10 years. He was a consultant to the Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) during the Reagan Administration.
